“Update about Textiles and Garment Investment Opportunities in Myanmar”



Hon. Felix KP CHUNG 鍾國斌議員, *Member of Legislative Council of the HKSAR (Textiles and Garment Sector) Chairman of the Hong Kong Apparel Society and Director of Chungweiming Knitting Factory Ltd.*

Hon. Felix Chung graduated from the Robert Gordon University Aberdeen, UK and BSC in Quantity Surveying in 1986 and obtained his MBA degree from Stirling University, Stirling, UK in 1987. He joined his family business of knitwear garment manufacturing in late 1988.

In 2001, with the support from several garment manufacturers, a non-profit association Hong Kong Apparel Society Ltd (HKAS) was founded to promote the interests of the industry. Hon. Felix Chung was the founder of HKAS, and was nominated to be the Chairman ever since. The missions of HKAS are to strengthen the ties among the Hong Kong SMEs in Textile and Garment industry, to provide a platform for exchanges of ideas and opinions within the trade, and to reflect the needs of the industry to the HKSAR government.

Hon. Felix Chung also plays an active role in fostering the development and nurturing the talents of the Textiles & Garment industry. In year 2010, he created the Fashion World Talent Award (HK version Project Runway) which aims to uncover talented fashion designers, fashion stylists and fashion photographers for fashion industries.

Last but not least, Hon. Felix Chung is newly elected as the Member of Legislative Council of the HKSAR (Textiles and Garment Sector) of 2012-2016, he was also elected in 2006 and 2011 to be the Election Committee Member in subsectors (Textile and Garment) to vote for the Chief Executive of the HKSAR.

Mr Marc Robert Compagnon is president of LF Sourcing overseeing Li & Fung's global agency business for apparel and hard goods as well as the sourcing for Li & Fung's distribution business. Joined Li & Fung in 2000 at the time of the acquisition of Colby International Limited where he was Chief Merchandising Officer for 17 years and was responsible for Colby's global sourcing network and sales and marketing strategies. Marc is also a Director of Li & Fung Limited. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Vermont and currently he is on the Advisory Board for the Business School at the University of Vermont. He is a founding member of Cotton's Revolutions and the Global Apparel, Footwear and Textile Initiative (GAFTI). Marc represents Li & Fung at The American Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong and is also Non-Executive Chairman of both Cebu Dream Realized Inc., a hotel and restaurant group and Blu Bathworks, a contemporary bathroom fixtures company.

Dr Raymond Yeung is a senior economist at Australia and New Zealand Banking Group. Based in Hong Kong, Raymond provides research on Greater China economics and shapes the bank's view on the regional economic outlook. His comments have been regularly cited in international and Chinese news media including Bloomberg, Reuters, Wall Street Journal, Financial Times and CCTV. Raymond also covers the offshore yuan market and coordinates, collaboratively with other business units to release "Internationalisation of the RMB", a well-read ANZ publication.

Before joining ANZ, Raymond was Deputy Head of Research at Swiss Re (Asia), covering the North Asian economy. He was also an Assistant Professor at the University of Hong Kong, following his early career at Deloitte and Hong Kong Policy Research Institute. He holds a PhD in Economics from Queen's University (Canada) and a Financial Risk Manager (FRM®) qualification.
